## I. Origin & Intention

The Ocean operates through:

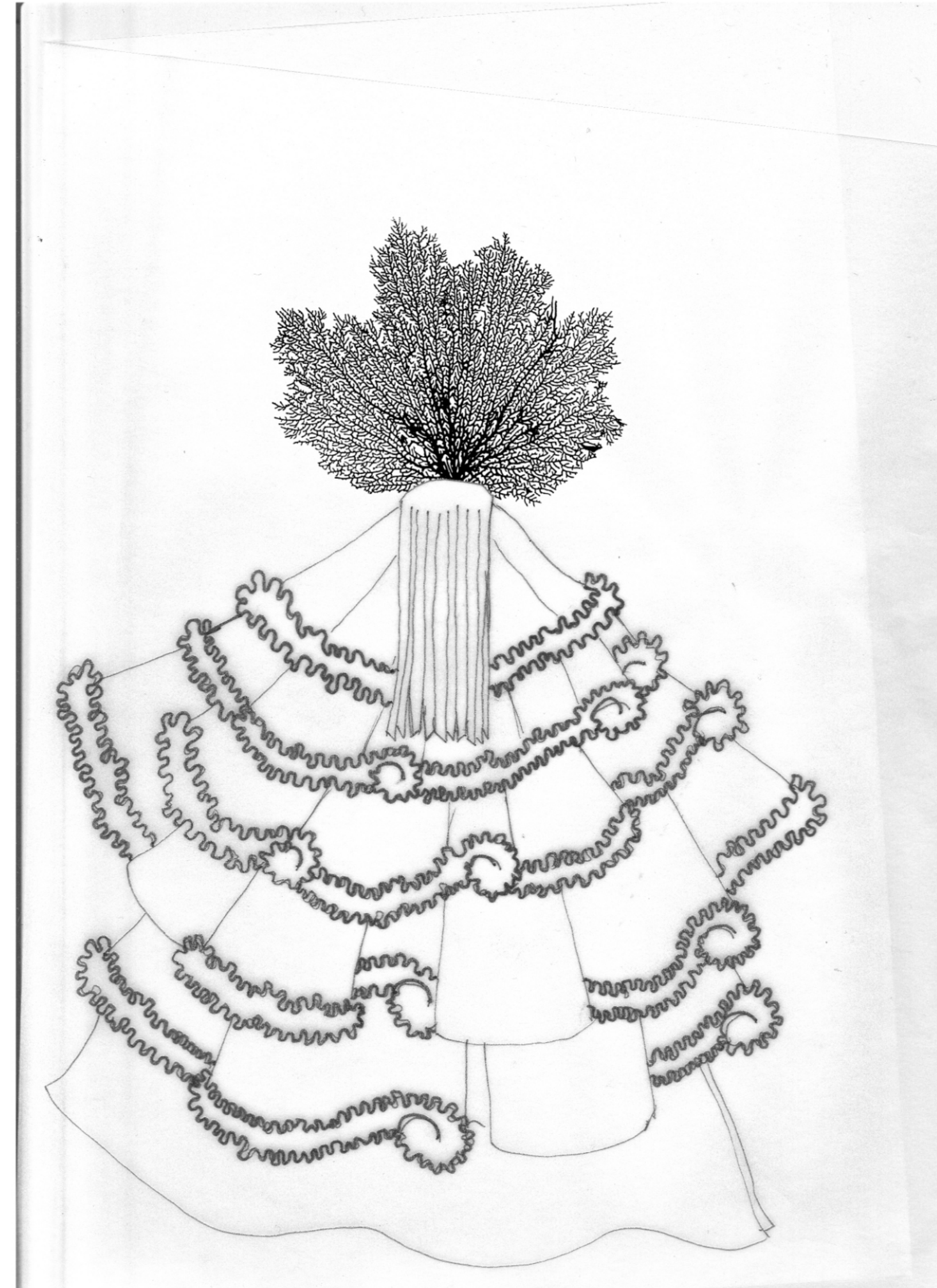
- Ecological responsibility

Its presence invites awareness, reflection, and exchange.

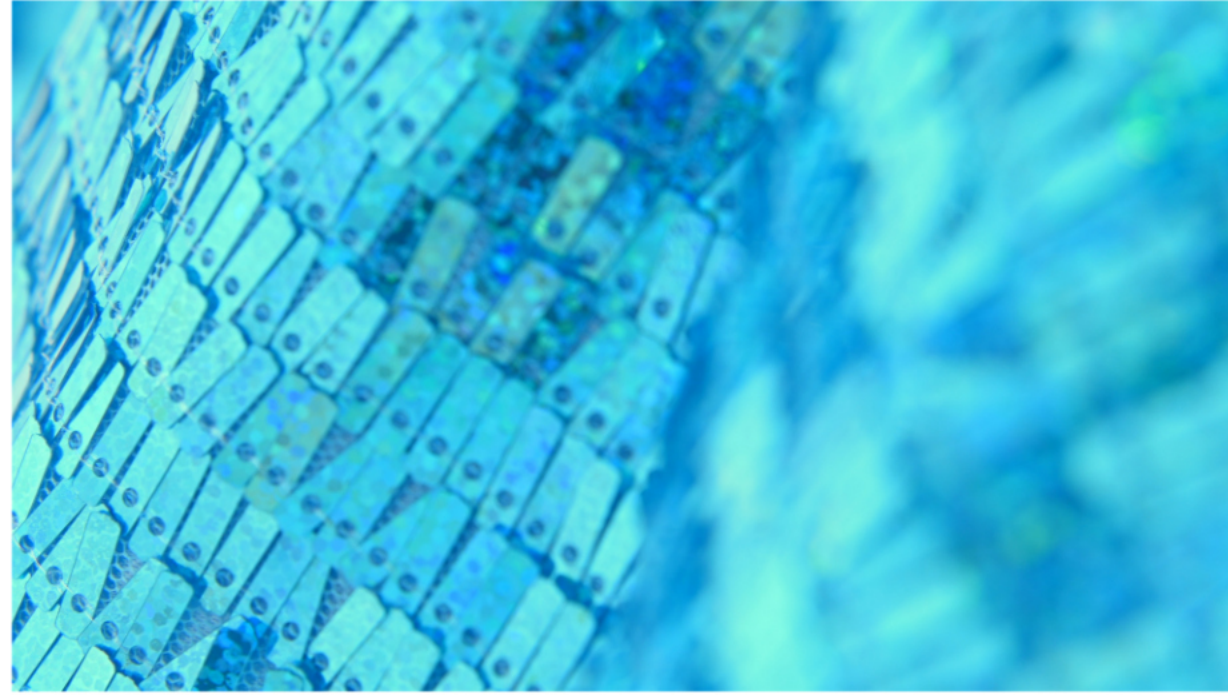


## Ideation.
